



# **MEDICATIONS**

▶ Bring all medication in the original packaging with the child's name, dosage, and when to administer clearly visible. Please only bring medications that your camper is currently taking. The Camp Infirmary has common over-the-counter medications available as needed, to be administered by the Camp Nurse.

CLOTHING
Do not bring favorite clothes as campers will be messy and sweaty during the week. Appropriate bra and underwear must be worn at all times.

### **GIFT SHOP & MISSIONS OFFERING MONEY**
